

Afghan girls' inalienable right to EDUCATION

Open Letter

The Taliban have dealt another heavy blow to Afghan women and girls by banning them from attending educational institutions and working for non-governmental organisations recently. These moves are the latest steps in an alarming trend and are deeply disturbing for the entire global community and must be revoked.

“Is being a **GIRL** in Afghanistan a crime? Is it my fault that I was born in Afghanistan? Why are women and girls' lesser human beings?” These are the questions asked by Afghan girls resoundingly today.

The recent ban on girls' education is unprecedented in Afghan history. Afghanistan is the only country in the world today that deprives girls of their basic right to education. The United Nations human rights mechanisms termed the exclusion of women and girls from secondary schools and universities a direct violation of the fundamental human rights and freedoms guaranteed in customary international law and human rights treaties to which Afghanistan is a party. The Organisation of Islamic Cooperation, national and international Muslim scholars deemed the Taliban decision to ban girls from school and universities against Islamic principles.

“Actions to exclude and silence women and girls continue to cause immense suffering and major setbacks to the potential of the Afghan people”, stated the UN secretary General, António Guterres as he termed the latest restrictions as “unjustifiable human rights violations”. The right to education is an indispensable means of realizing other human rights. As an enabling right, education is the primary vehicle by which economically and socially marginalized adults and children can lift themselves out of poverty and obtain the means to participate fully in their communities. Education is an unparalleled financial investment a household and community can make. It is the only path for a country out of the financial, political and humanitarian crisis.

Right to education is explicitly guaranteed in Islam. Muslim scholars have long advocated for women and girls' access to education – since Islam explicitly calls for “*men and women to pursue knowledge from the cradle to the grave.*” “*The pursuit of knowledge is obligatory upon every Muslim; and the first word revealed of the Quran was “Read”.*” The Taliban have acted against these authoritative religious commandments and their own pledges to respect and protect women and girls' rights including the right to education.

The Taliban had 16 months to address any concerns related to uniform, provision of a suitable educational environment, logistical or other issues. With these recent acts, the Taliban are on the path of dragging the country into the dark ages.

In contrast to the Taliban claims, there had never been any traditional or cultural impediments to girls' education in Afghanistan. Exactly, 100 years ago, Queen Soraya opened the first girl's school in Kabul. Girls were not prevented from attending schools and higher education institutions even during the civil war. Before August 2021, 9.2 million children (38 per cent of whom were girls) were in school and female literacy rate stood at 30%. Four out of ten students were girls and there was a doubling of female literacy for most of the past decade. Some provinces, like Herat witnessed more than 50% girls as students.

The latest ban by the Taliban on women working for NGOs is yet another blow. At least five well-known INGOs have halted work in Afghanistan after the ban. This will adversely impact humanitarian assistance in a grave manner since it is impossible to deliver humanitarian aid without women employees. Several women and journalists protesting the ban on work and education have been arrested. Many university professors have resigned in protest as well. A pall of anger, gloom and despair is enveloping Afghan women, men and communities.

Girls and women simply demand to “**Go to School, Go to parks, Go to work, Engage in sport, Move freely and nurture their dreams. These are basic asks and entitlements by virtue of being humans and not slaves.**”

The internationally community bears considerable responsibility for the current situation in Afghanistan and Afghan girls and women seek your support in raising your voices in their support. Inaction could risk a total gender apartheid and disaster that the world will not be able to contain. Other extremist and retrogressive forces are watching the world's response and failure to act now will only embolden them to replicate misogyny and erasure of women in other parts of the world. The Taliban must be persuaded to reverse the decision on education and restore all women and girls rights.

The Taliban must realise that power comes with responsibilities and governance comes with accountability to its citizens. They should reverse these decisions immediately, open the doors of all educational institutions to women and girls and allow women to work. Respect the will and demand of the Afghan people as well as the commandments of Islam; Heed the loud voices of women and of the International Community at large;

Considering the above, Afghans demand the following:

Afghan girls' inalienable right to EDUCATION

- **The International Community, United Nations and world leaders should pursue not only diplomatic channels but also consider targeted sanctions against the Taliban leadership. This should include with immediate effect travel bans including to the neighbouring countries, asset freezes, and public disclosure of the access to education that Taliban leadership support for their own daughters.**
- **The Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) should convene an urgent debate of religious leaders with the purpose of issuing a Fatwa stressing that girls' education is not only compatible with Islam but also a well-recognised right and preferred practice in countries with large and small Muslim communities.**
- **Explore alternative options to fill the gap by providing online and community-based education to girls.**
